About the Conference

A fifth of the global population face disabilities of diverse kinds, experiencing adverse socio economic conditions and marginalization. Barriers continue in the path of economic and social inclusion of Persons with disabilities (PWD). Enhancing the opportunities that ensure a sustainable future is a pressing concern and education is a major area to be addressed.

Access to education and employment without discrimination, for PWD is the goal of the RPWD (Rights of PWD) Act, 2016. It states that 'the appropriate Government shall ensure that the PWD enjoy the right to equality, life with dignity, and respect for his or her own integrity equally with others.' It insists on ensuring a barrier free environment for the PWD.

Every child with benchmark disability between the age group of 6 to 18 years is entitled for Right to free education. The RPWD Act, 2016 advocates measures to give quality education for PWD in comprehensive classrooms to ensure equity and inclusion.

In spite of laws, and legislations modifying them periodically, measures in practice are still largely inadequate. UNICEF reports that, of 240 million children with disabilities, 49% are more likely to have been deprived of education in comparison to those without disabilities.

Inaccessible physical environments and transportation, unavailability of assistive devices and technologies, non-adapted means of communication, gaps in service delivery, conflicts, crisis and social isolation are amongst the several challenges that continue to frustrate their hopes. Governments have initiated reforms for providing equal opportunities for PWD yet the situation remains grim. Universal designs for their self reliance and unhindered social participation must be actualized.

This conference on 'Augmenting Education of Persons with Disabilities: Trends and Possibilities' would survey and suggest ways to overcome barriers in the path of education for persons with disabilities and appropriate integration of PWD into mainstream society. The conference seeks to find ways to ensure the participation of PWD in arts, sports, culture or any other social activity. It will foster discussions on the different forms of disabilities and tailoring education for each to ensure their all-round development. This conference will focus on ways to ensure the right to equal education for all persons with disabilities to ensure that they have access to a high standard of life.
