TNTEU PRACTICAL EXAMINATION FOR B.ED./B.Ed.(Spl.Edn.)-2nd Year

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The Practical Examinations pertaining to B.Ed./B.Ed.(Spl. Edn.) Degree for 2nd Year students admitted during the academic year 2018-2019 was successfully conducted. Around 58,000 students attended the practical examinations. Nearly 1400 staff members were appointed as

examiners to conduct the practical examinations.

This is the first time the examiners were appointed by the way of computerized randomization.

The practical marks were also entered through online mode by the examiners and the marks were stored in the university website server. The steps for entry of practical

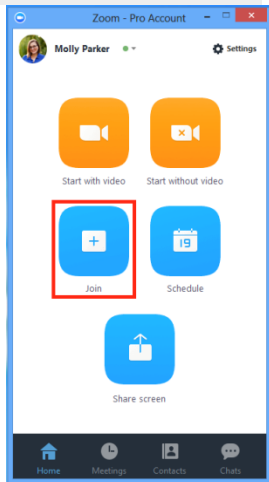
2020. Prizes were distributed to the winners.

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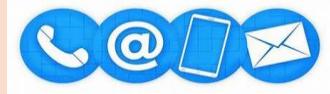
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
